Jean Helgesen, biology professor, has a new book published and on sale in the college bookstore. The study guide, titled Student Resource Manual to Accompany The World of Biology, is an ancillary for the non-majors biology textbook released by Saunders College Publishing and used for Biology 151 and 152. Jean has also recently completed an article on Nobel Prize winners Joseph Goldstein and Michael Brown, her former employers at Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, to be published by Salem Press in late 1991. Salem Press will include nine other articles by Jean on cell and molecular biology and genetics in Magill's Survey of Science: Life Science Series, to be released in early 1991.

Ralph Long, speech professor, was the guest speaker at the August meeting of the McKinney Chamber of Commerce Ambassador's Club. 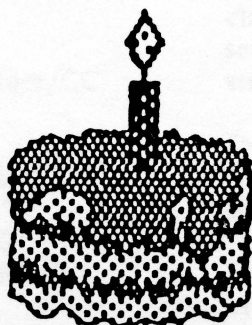
