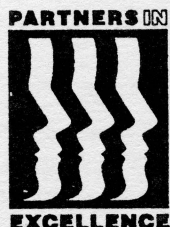

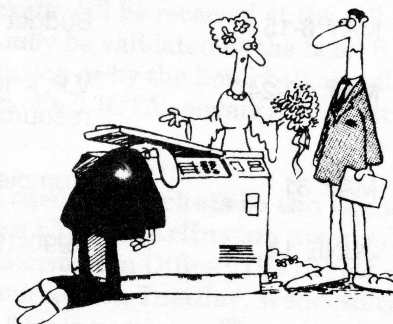

- FEBRUARY 8** President issues institutional priorities for 1991-1992.
- President informs vice presidents of estimated resources for each of their divisions for next fiscal year.
- FEB. 11-25** Vice presidents inform deans/directors of estimated resources.
Deans/Directors inform cost center managers of estimated resources.
- Chairman of Strategic Planning Task Force meets with VP's and Deans/directors in each major college division to discuss the 1991 planning process.
- FEBRUARY 18** Cost center managers (ccm's) receive instructions for updating 1990-1995 strategic plans for the period 1991-1994. Ccm's who lack the most recent strategic plans for their areas should contact the Office of Institutional Research.
- FEB. 18-MAR. 11** As they update their strategic plans, ccm's meet and consult with members of their staffs, deans/directors, vice presidents, and others; they receive enrollment projections, demographic data, and survey results to assist them in their planning.
- FEB. 25/26** Strategic Planning Workshops: Orientation and Refresher.
- MARCH 11** Ccm's submit drafts of strategic plans/budgets to their deans/directors.
- MARCH 25** Deans/directors return drafts of strategic plans to ccm's.
- APRIL 1** Ccm's submit final drafts to deans/directors.
- APRIL 8** Deans/directors submit drafts of strategic plans/budgets to vice presidents.
- APRIL 19** Vice presidents return drafts to deans/directors.
- APRIL 22** Deans/directors consult ccm's on proposed revisions to ccm's plans/budgets.
- APRIL 26** Deans/directors submit final drafts to vice presidents.
- MAY 2** Vice presidents submit drafts of plans/budgets to president.
- MAY 6-15** Budget presentations by division on each campus.
- MAY 20-24** V.P.'s in conjunction with president reconcile budget request with projected resources.
- MAY 31** Completed Strategic Plan sent to printer.
- JUNE 14** 1990-1995 Strategic Plan is published.
