The facts:

Multiple Sclerosis is a chronic, sometimes progressive disease of the central nervous system (brain and spinal cord) which most often affects young adults.

Onset of symptoms most often occur between the ages of 20 and 40 years, with women affected twice as often as men, and whites twice as often as blacks.

Although a cure has not yet been found, many symptoms can be relieved, complications can be prevented and drugs are available which may slow or halt disease progression in some cases.

CCCC Classification Council

**What is the Classification Council?**

The CCCC Classification Council is a group composed of nine full-time faculty and staff representing all employee levels of the college. Five members are elected by a vote of all faculty and staff in a college-wide election conducted by the All College Council; four are appointed by Dr. Anthony.

**How can the classification process be accessed?**

Any employee may initiate the process by submitting an updated position description to the Human Resources Office. Procedures for the classification process and a job evaluation questionnaire will then be provided by Human Resources to the employee.
