Comedienne to Highlight CCCC "Celebration of Excellence"

A performance by nationally-known comedienne **Paula Poundstone** will headline Collin County Community College's week-long "Celebration of Excellence" during the week of April 22-27.

Ms. Poundstone will perform Friday, April 26, in the Plano Centre to capture the evening's theme "Laughter's the Best Medicine." The performance will highlight the CCCC Foundation's annual fundraising event.

A silent auction will be held and an "intravenous" buffet will be available before the performance. Tickets for the evening's entertainment are \$30 each, with special patron seating available for \$75 each.

Ms. Poundstone is one of the fastest-rising comedienues in the nation, winning the American Comedy Award as the "Funniest Female Stand-up Comic" in 1989. She has been featured in both Time magazine and The New York Times and has starred in her own television special for HBO titled "Cats, Cops and Stuff."

She has also made numerous television appearances including The Tonight Show, Late Night with David Letterman, Not Necessarily the News, One Night Stand (HBO), Gary Shandling, Saturday Night Live, Evening at the Improv, Women of the Night (HBO), Just for Laughs (Showtime) and The Young Comedians (HBO).

She has also made numerous appearances at comedy clubs including The Improv in Los Angeles and New York, Catch A Rising Star in New York, The Punchline in San Francisco, The Ice House in Pasadena, California; and Other Cafe in San Francisco.

Born in Alabama, Ms. Poundstone was reared in Massachusetts before moving to San Francisco. She now lives in Los Angeles. She averages 45 weeks on the road a year making appearances across the country.

The 1991 "Celebration of Excellence" offers a week-long series of public events which focus on health care and wellness in Collin County. "Commitment to Wellness" has been adopted as

the theme for the week.
