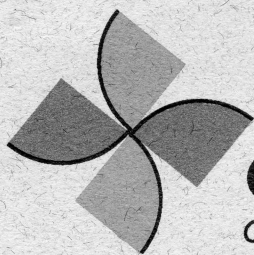

## CCCC Employee Newsletter Takes on a New Look!

The Public Information Office has redesigned the employee newsletter to be more of what you're looking for. The same newsworthy information, but presented in a more pleasing, magazine-like format.

The idea behind the redesign came from brain-

storming sessions among our staff. Our thought was that we needed to have the *Caleidoscope* become a bi-weekly "magazine" that everyone would look forward to receiving—to read about themselves and their colleagues. In this column each issue, we will have feature stories from throughout the college and pertinent articles reprinted from other periodicals.

The masthead was redesigned by Virginia McLean, publications coordinator. "I wanted the newsletter to have a more interesting, eye-catching design—so more people would be interested in picking it up," she said. "The idea behind the green and blue swirl came from trying to have CCCC's printed pieces more environmentally safe—using more recycled papers, and watching quantities printed and overruns."

The new stock for the *Caleidoscope* is made from 50 percent waste paper, containing at least 10 percent post-consumer waste. For more information on recycled papers, watch for future articles on topics such as post-consumer waste, unbleached paper and recycled papers.

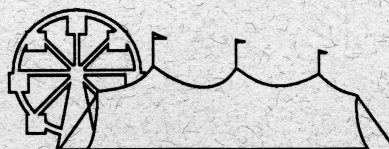
