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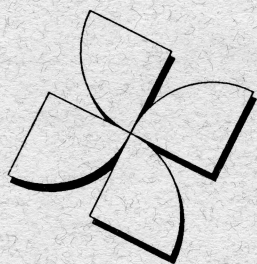

On July 15, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board approved CCCC's proposal to offer a 61-credit hour associate of applied science degree in criminal justice with an emphasis in either law enforcement or corrections. Classes for the new degree program begin this fall.

The unprecedented and persistent high levels of crime have created many employment and career opportunities for graduates of criminal justice programs. All federal, state and local labor forecasting agencies predict substantial growth in law enforcement and corrections employment well into the next century, thus CCCC's new program offers its students the opportunity for a successful career in either of these two fields.
