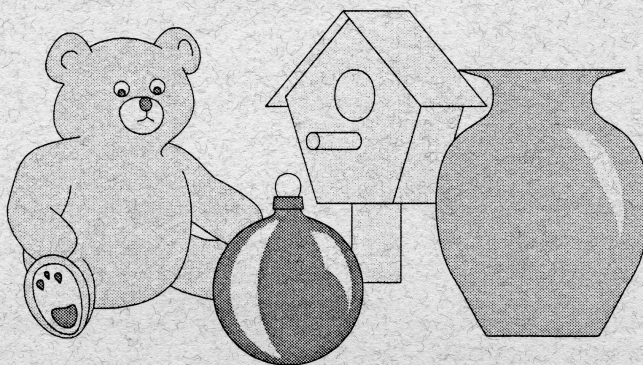

### Rubino and Breedlove Discuss ESL Placement

Edelin Rubino and Peggy Breedlove, developmental education faculty members, presented "Are You Using the MTELP for Placement?" at the Texas Teachers to Speakers of Other Languages (TEXTESOL) conference on Nov. 5 in Dallas. Their presentation included research they did showing the inappropriateness of using the Michigan Test of English Language Proficiency (MTELP) as a placement test for lower level ESL classes.

Barbara Devitt and Donna Sauls, nursing faculty members, participated in the Oct. 13 national teleconference "Nurses Respond to President Clinton's Health Care Reform" on the Health and Sciences Television Network. ## T R U T H S

Here is another of Dr. Anthony's "truths." By remembering and applying these truths to our daily tasks, we as individuals, and as a college, can continue to make a difference in the lives of our students, staff and faculty.

"The sixth truth: real learning connotes use. Teaching that does not require the use of information is not instruction but merely exposure. If something isn't going to be immediately used or applied, it won't get learned. Knowing and action work in tandem. Telling students they will use or need something later on, even though it has no immediate value, is a waste of time. It will not be learned—which is why professors in subsequent courses a year or two down the road, find they need to reteach what they assumed their students already knew.

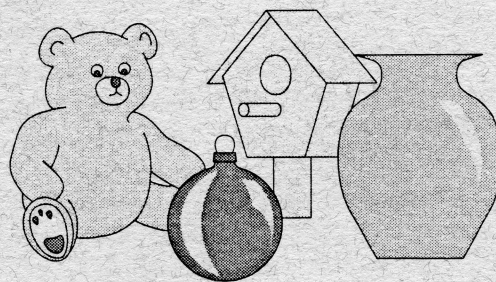

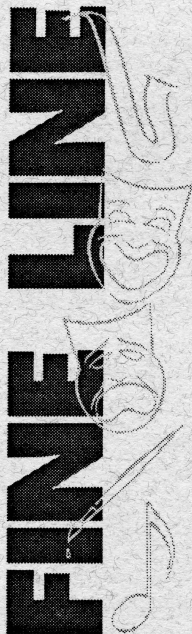
