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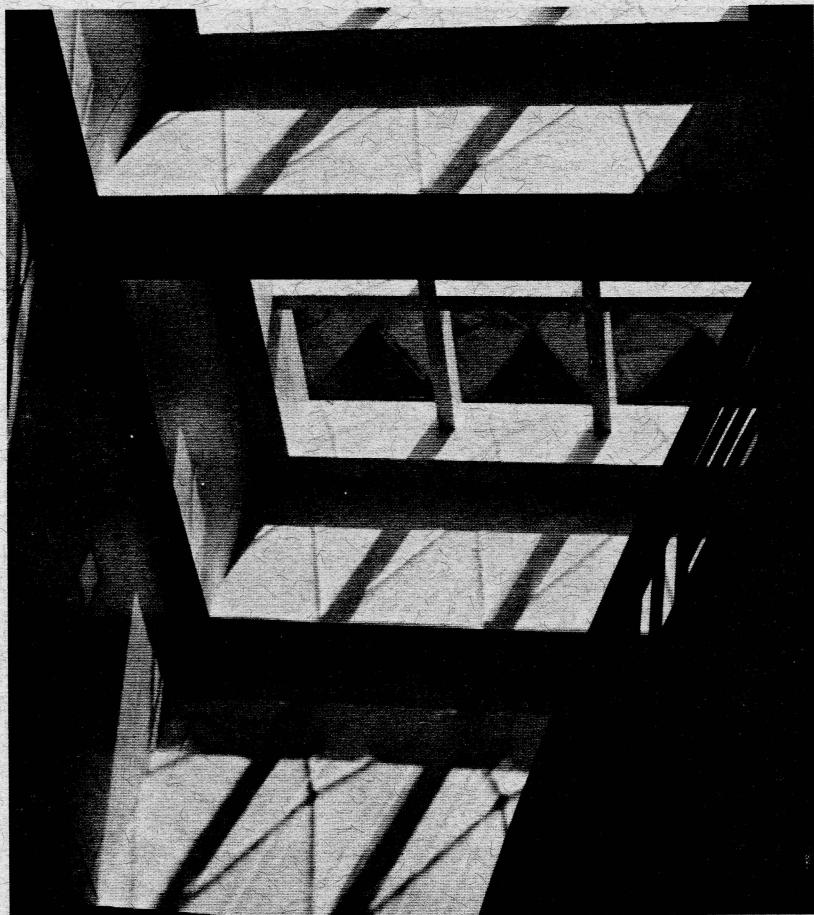

Paula Parker (Allen) joins CCCC as a mail receiving clerk. Parker has worked for the college on a temporary assignment since December 1994.

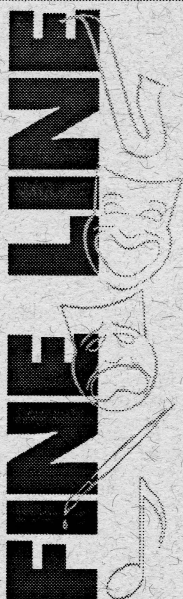
