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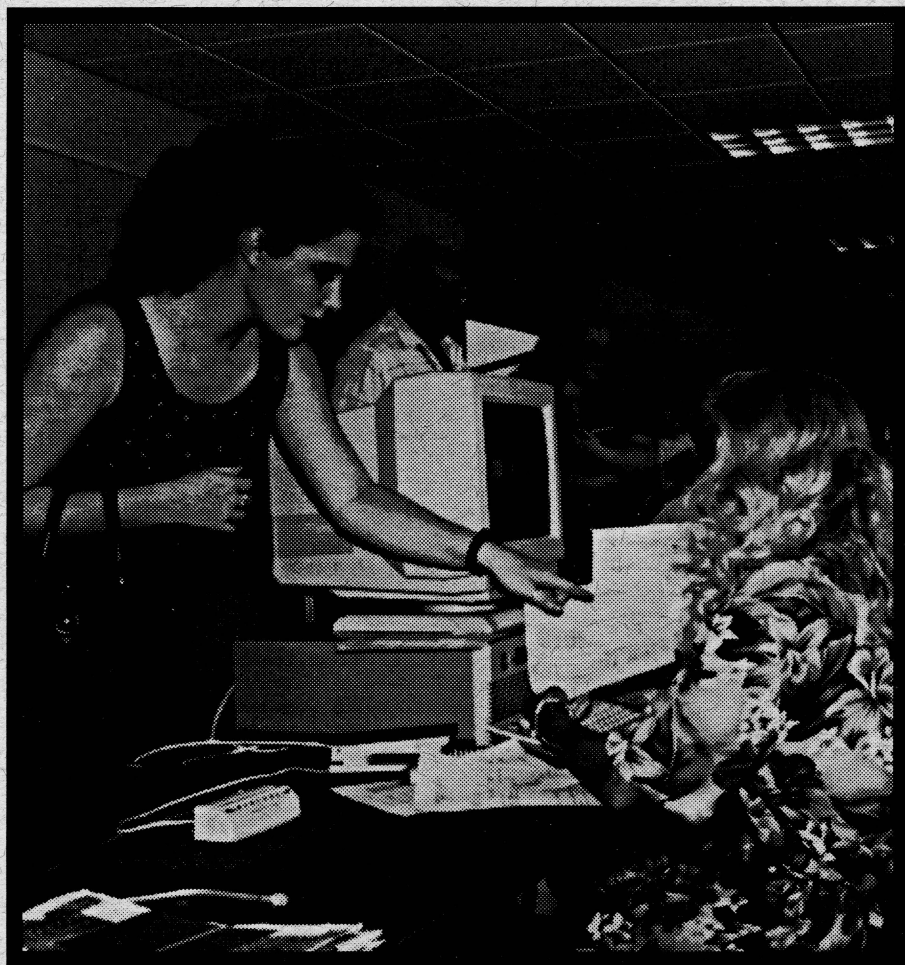

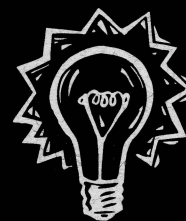
CCCC BREAKS 10,000 MARK!

The official headcount for fall 1995 registration was 10,330 as of August 28, that's a 4.31% increase from fall 1994 registration. Site counts for individual campuses are as follows: Spring Creek, 8,117; Central Park, 1,483; Preston Ridge, 1,367. Additional registration as well as adds and drops continued through the week.

On the Continuing Education front, nearly 2,200 students have enrolled for the first quarter.

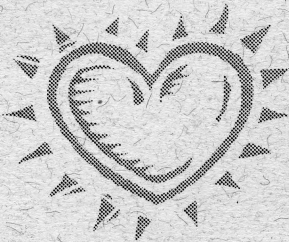

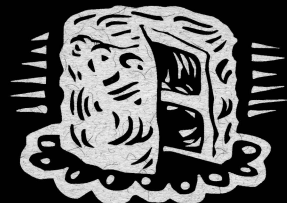

A SUCCESS STORY

Meranda weighed in at a whopping 4.2 pounds. She was six weeks early and her little body was not prepared to greet the world. Her lungs could not take in and expel the oxygen she needed to survive. She was placed in the pediatric intensive care unit and her parents watched as she dropped to 3.8 pounds and struggled with every breath.

There is a happy ending to this story. After three weeks, Meranda's tiny body began to respond to the loving care she received and she was released from the hospital. She was strapped into a brand new car seat and the family headed for home. The fuzzy headed baby's first best friend rode on the seat next to her, connected by a lifeline that would not be severed for more than three months. The breathing monitor would sound its lifesaving alarm hundreds of times before baby Meranda was out of the woods.

Today, my niece Meranda is a healthy, happy four-year-old, thanks to the monitor and caring instruction and follow up by the local Red Cross, a United Way agency. There are many other stories like Meranda's. Maybe you know one. And there are many other agencies whose caring and sharing create happy endings.

The agencies of the State Employees Charitable Campaign and the people who staff them are devoted to saving and improving the quality of life for millions across our nation and closer to home, right here in Collin County.
