The second Cecil H. and Ida M. Green Distinguished Lecture for 1988-89 is hosted by the School of Social Sciences at The University of Texas at Dallas. The lecture is scheduled for 7pm on Thursday, March 2, in the Conference Center on the U.T. Dallas campus. Guest lecturer for the evening will be Neal R. Peirce, a syndicated columnist with the Washington Post Writers Group. Mr. Peirce has a rare vision of the energy and complexity of America's cities and states and how they interact with the federal government. Time magazine has described him as "the only national chronicler of grassroots America."

A contributing editor of the National Journal, which he helped found, Peirce has acted as elections consultant and commentator for CBS News and NBC News and has appeared on "MacNeil/Lehrer," "Meet The Press," and the "Today" show. His books, including The Megastates of America and The Book of America: Inside Fifty States Today, have received wide critical acclaim. The title of Peirce's address will be "The American City: Learning to Think Strategically."

There was a washing machine in the new house when we moved in, but it isn't working too good. Last week I put 14 shirts into it, pulled the chain, and I haven't seen the shirts since.

Your sister, Mary, had a baby this morning. I haven't found out whether it is a boy or a girl so I don't know whether you are an aunt or an uncle.

Your Uncle Dick drowned last week in a vat of whickey in Dublin Brewery. Some of his workmates dived in to save him but he fought them off bravely. We cremated his body and it took us three days to put out the fire.

Your father didn't have much to drink at Christmas. I put a bottle of Castor Oil in his pint of beer and it kept him going 'till New Year's Day.

I went to the doctor on Thursday and your father went with me. The doctor put a small tube into my mouth and told me not to open it for ten minutes. Your father offered to buy it from him.

It only rained twice last week. First for three days and then for four days. Monday it was so windy that one of our hens laid the same egg four times.

We had a letter from the undertaker. He said if the last installment wasn't paid on your grandmother within seven days - up she comes.

Your loving mother.

P.S. I was going to send you \$10 but I had already sealed the envelope.
