Seniors graduating this spring from public or private high schools in Texas have until Wednesday, March 15, to apply for a \$1,500 college scholarship available under the Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program administered by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Students who obtain a GED certificate, equivalent to a high school diploma, before March 15 are also eligible to apply. Students who apply for a Byrd scholarship will be considered automatically for the Governor's Recognition Award Program. Although no funds have been set aside for that program, selected students will receive a certificate of recognition signed by the governor.

Students interested in these programs should contact their school counselors or local GED centers. Each school or GED center can submit no more than three applications for the Byrd Scholarship or Governor's Recognition Award. Applications for these programs must be post-

marked by 5pm Wednesday, March 15, and sent to the following address: Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program, Division of Student Services, Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, P.O. Box 12788, Capitol Station, Austin, TX 78711.

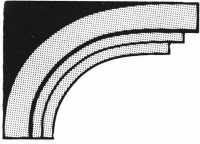

SUBJECT: Update on SACS Visit

A hearty congratulations to everyone at CCCC - the results of our SACS visit were extraordinary. We should all take a great deal of pride in this very significant accomplishment for it clearly reflects the quality of our people, our programs, and our services. Having had the opportunity to serve on some eighteen (18) accrediting teams over the years in three different associations and having experienced five (5) previous visits to campuses with which I was affiliated, not one of those twenty-three (23) experiences came anywhere near the report we received from the accrediting team. Just seven recommendations is unheard of in accrediting circles. The recommendations of the Committee were as follows:

## Undergraduate Curriculum

1. The visiting committee recommends the College develop and implement a college-wide process to assess periodically its existing programs and courses.
2. Two degree programs do not have at least one full-time faculty member assigned to them. These programs are agriculture and ornamental horticulture. The visiting committee recommends that the college complete its assessment of these programs and either employ full time faculty or discontinue the programs.

## Undergraduate Instruction

1. The visiting committee recommends that the College move deliberately toward the realization of its goal of a 70/30 ratio of full-time to part-time faculty and that the College look closely at its present FT/PT ratio and ensure the appropriateness of this ratio in light of its past and projected growth in its student enrollment.

## Educational Support Services

### Collections

1. The committee recommends that the College take the necessary steps to ensure the appropriate primary and secondary materials to support the informational needs of all students are available in all LRC collections.
2. The committee recommends that the College take immediate steps to provide the necessary journals and periodicals for the nursing program.

### **Financial and Physical Resources**

#### **Financial Resources**

1. The committee recommends that the Board of Trustees approve a statement of the College's investment policies and guidelines.

#### **Physical Resources**

1. The committee recommends that the institution adopt a comprehensive safety plan and that it be maintained and regularly evaluated.

Within the next two weeks we will be receiving a complete draft of the report and will have until May to respond to the recommendations. Our official accreditation status will be awarded at a June meeting of the Commission. Then we will have a five (5) year hiatus before the reaccreditation visit. The foundation which we have established, however, will do us well in all our future endeavors.

Again, my sincere thanks to the entire College community. People are what makes this College a great place to be. During the next few months we will be busy going through the process of hiring some forty additional teaching and non-teaching staff. It is important that each of you take the opportunity to participate in the open interview and evaluation process to assure that we are getting the best people possible for our College. Let's continue to strive toward greatness.
