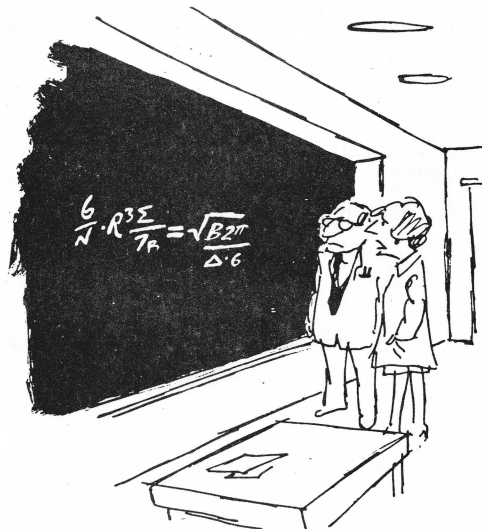
FIT TIP
