RECENT POLICY DECISIONS RELATED TO THE TEXAS ACADEMIC SKILLS PROGRAM (TASP) - High school students who graduate in the spring of 1989 can be exempted from taking the TASP Test in three ways: (1) by attending a college or university during the summer of 1989, (2) through concurrent enrollment at a local college or university while still in high school, or (3) by advanced placement testing including ACT, CLEP, or any other mechanism that results in advanced credit. In any of these cases, the student must earn three or more hours of college credit. The three credit hours used to exempt a student from taking the TASP Test do not have to be applicable to a degree, but they must be college level.

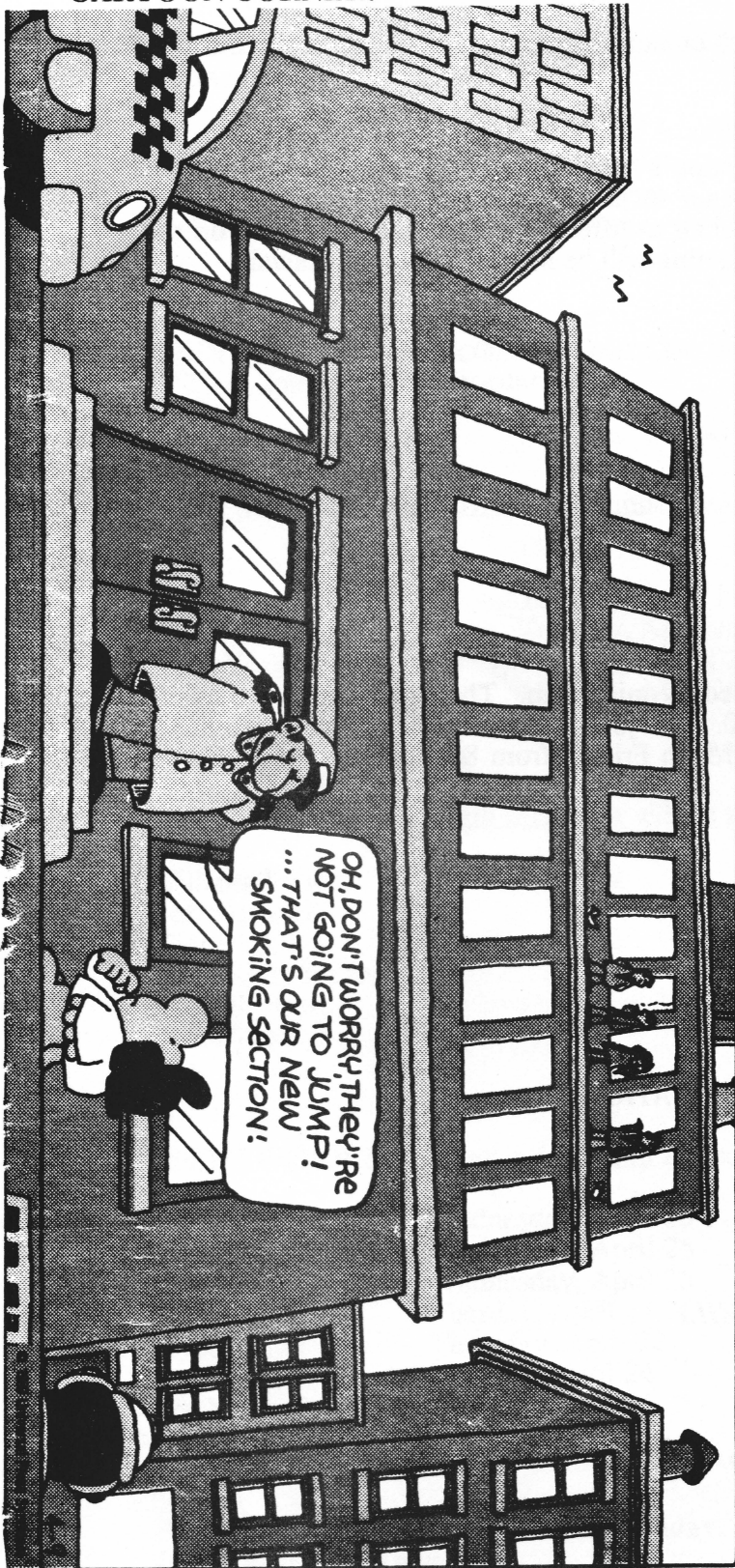
## LATEST FROM THE LRC:
