A History of the French Revolution.

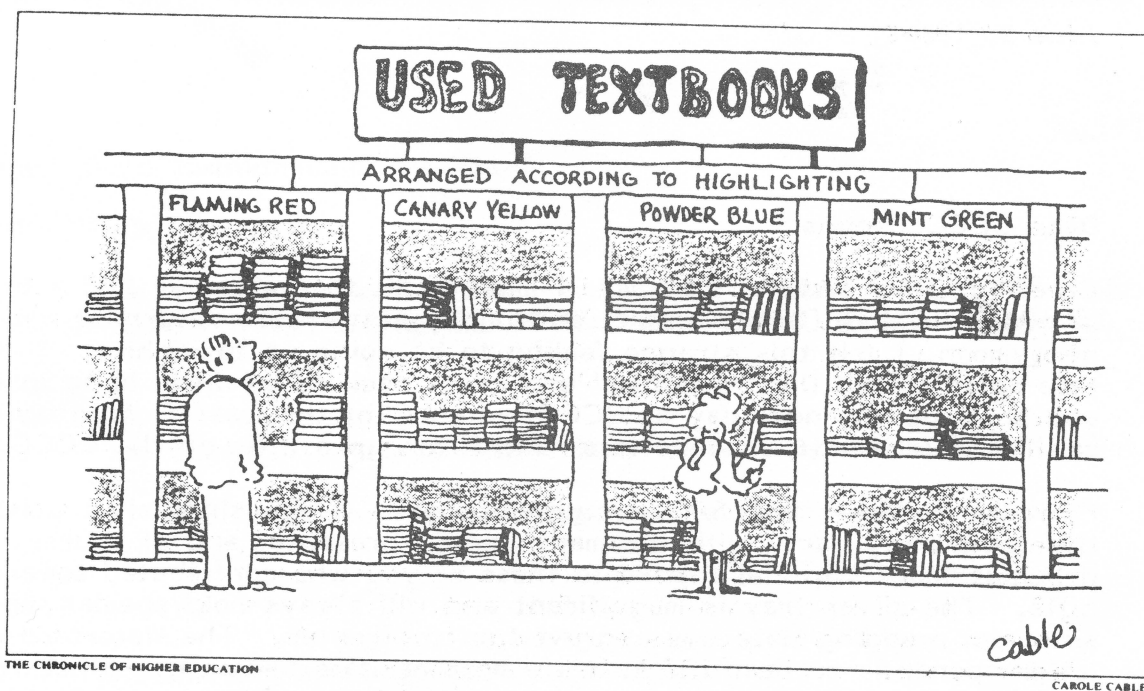
Innumeracy, by John Paulos
