June 20 Board Meeting Highlights:

Central Campus Site Plan

The Board approved SHWC, Inc, Architects, Engineers, Planners, selection to provide architectural services for the development of a site plan and construction area requirements for the proposed expansion at the Central Campus. SHWC will provide a site plan showing Phase I expansion along with a Phase II and Phase III expansion with an anticipated maximum size of 250,000 square feet at the Central Campus. The site plan will include the proposed extension of the entrance road on the west side of the property and will incorporate expanded parking requirements that will be required due to new construction. Outdoor recreational facilities will also be located. As part of the initial phase, SHWC will update anticipated construction budgets and work with the College to finalize area requirements for Phase I.

Tuition Increase

The Board approved the following tuition schedule for the 1989-90 Academic Year and the elimination of the Student Activity Fee. The decision to eliminate the fee was based on the Board's attempt at making tuition and fees as clear and simple as possible. The student activity program will now be funded from the general fund beginning FY 89-90.
