If, when you enter WP50 at the C prompt (C:\>), it takes you directly into a WordPerfect screen, try this: C:\>cd WP50\LEARN. This will take you into the subdirectory LEARN. The prompt will look like this: C:\WP50\Learn>. Now enter TUTOR. This should take you into the tutorials.

When you exit the tutorials the prompt will look like this: C:\WP50\LEARN>.
Enter cd C:\ to exit WordPerfect.

If the River Was Whiskey, by T. Coraghessan Boyle
