From buildings tall—they fall

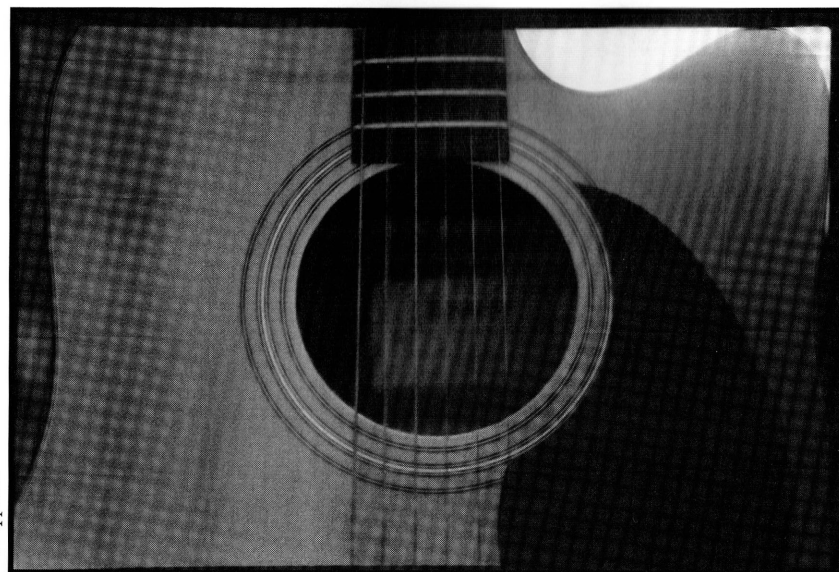
